#### **BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE**

Francis Henderson James (referred to as both Henney and Hennie in the papers) was born in 1888 in Rapides Parish, Louisiana. His parents were Francis Henderson James and Vanangus "Nangie" Amelia Sleet James, who had eight additional children: Trenton, Rosanna, Florence, Lucy, Margaret, Ella, Nancy, and Vanangus. Trent L. James would later marry Willie Frank Texada, the daughter of a political and landholding family from Rapides Parish. Francis James graduated from Louisiana State University (LSU) in 1912 with a B.S. in Electrical Engineering and received his M.S. in Sugar Engineering in 1913. He served in the U.S. Army during World War I. He married Jessie M. Broadwell in 1926, and they had four children: Francis, Jr., Marilyn, Trenton, and Margaret Anne. After spending seventeen years in the sugar industry (first in Puerto Rico, then in Santo Domingo with family), Francis James was employed as chief engineer from the 1930s to 1950s at the Salzburg Sugar Factory (also spelled as Salsburg in the papers) on the Salzburg Plantation in St. James Parish, Louisiana. He died in a Baton Rouge hospital of pneumonia and other complications resulting from injuries sustained in an automobile accident on September 2, 1959, in Burnside, Louisiana.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Francis Henderson James Papers contain personal papers and genealogical items; personal and business correspondence; professional papers; financial and insurance papers; photographic items; certificates; newspaper clippings; printed ephemera; manuscript volumes; and other materials detailing the personal and professional history of an LSU alum, World War I veteran, and sugar engineer.

Personal papers and genealogical items (1869-1959, undated) include family obituaries; Francis James' report book while at Boyce High School in Boyce, Louisiana (circa 1900); James' petition for degrees of Masonry at Boyce Lodge (April 17, 1909); two copies of the printed bylaws of the Grand Consistory of Louisiana, No. 2 (1912, 1932); James' certificate of 25 years membership in the Grand Consistory of Louisiana, No. 32, New Orleans, Louisiana (November 1, 1945); and a negative photocopy of James' death certificate (October 23, 1959).

Items of note in the personal correspondence include a letter to Francis James from William Briant informing James of his election as a member of the Grand Consistory of Louisiana (October 10, 1919); letters from Vanangus "Nangie" James to her children in the months before her death in 1932 (1931-1932); and a letter to Mrs. Marlyn Neathery from G. J. Durbin, Vice-President of the American Sugar Cane League, expressing regret at the death of Francis James and containing a resolution from the executive committee of the League acknowledging James' career and life (November 17, 1959). The resolution mentions James' work at the Helvetia Sugar Co-operative in Donaldsonville, Louisiana.

Business correspondence and professional papers document Francis James' career and work in the sugar industry in Louisiana and abroad, especially in Puerto Rico, and James family property. Items of note include two letters from Queen City Realty Company, Shreveport, Louisiana, regarding the partition of lots in Caddo Heights and the Oil Fields (June 23, July 15, 1908); a letter from the United States Veterans Bureau to James regarding his Adjusted Service Certificate (January 1, 1925); and a blueprint map sheet from the State of Louisiana Department of Highways showing right of way required across property of Francis James in Rapides Parish for the Alexandria Bypass project (August 10, 1943).

Other items of note are the diary Francis James kept from 1937 to 1958 documenting his work as chief engineer at the Salzburg Sugar Factory; materials documenting his time as an LSU student, his travels, his work abroad, and family connections in Central Louisiana; and several items relating to Trent L. James, who served as the Rapides Parish Assessor from 1921 to 1973. For a folder-level description, see the **CONTAINER LIST**.
